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Overview

Burgundy is a region defined by terroir, so this brochure is set out accordingly. Starting with wines from Chablis, we work our way south, to the Côte d'Or, and then on to the Mâconnais and Beaujolais. Some domaines make wines from numerous villages; they are listed in the village that we feel best defines them.

2018: IMPOSSIBLE TO DEFINE

Over the last couple of months, I have spent almost three weeks in Burgundy, visiting dozens of producers, tasting hundreds of wines, driving thousands of kilometres.

And I leave more intrigued, beguiled and passionate about Burgundy than ever before.

2018 has taken some time for me to figure out. It's a vintage which can undoubtedly tend towards greatness in both reds and whites, where the highs are incredibly high.

But it's also a vintage where not every wine has succeeded, and where picking your producer, and your wine, is key.

This is a carefully curated selection, with wines that I wholeheartedly believe will give huge pleasure, in the short, medium, and long term.

It's a year that can amaze and impress: I encourage you to allow it to do just that.

The growing season: lights, camera, action

2018 was hot. As far as the stats go, it was the hottest since 2003, and one of the driest, too. But, of course, the story is far more nuanced than that

Whereas years like 2003 were defined by intense periods of hot weather, 2018 lacked heat spikes. Rather, it was warmth from April onwards that tipped the averages up, while nights that kept their heat also counted.

Olivier Lamy explained that, more importantly than warmth, it was the amount of sunlight in 2018 that defined the vintage. Red grapes, with their dark skins, were more affected by this sunlight, meaning that sugars, and in turn alcohol, could rise incredibly fast, even if the grapes were not totally ripe phenolically.



This made work in the vineyard, and ultimately picking date, vital. The earliest pickers started around 21st August, and even on the Côte de Nuits some were forced to harvest early: Ghislaine Barthod picked her Beaux Bruns on 26th August (the quality of the wine justifies the decision).

But you did not need to pick early to make great wines: Domaine Grivot in Vosne-Romanée did not start until after many of their peers had finished. They made some of the most thrilling, remarkable wines I've tasted in Burgundy.

While yields were, on the whole, impressive - or to use the Bourguignon term, "très correcte" - some were unlucky: as France settled down to watch the World Cup Final on 15th July, the southern tip of Nuits-Saint-Georges, and much of Côtes de Nuits Villages, was decimated by a hailstorm. Fortunately, while yields here were hit, in my experience quality at affected domaines remains high.

The reds: the time for the little guys

At the time of the Hospices de Beaune last year, a couple of months after the 2018 harvest, some were speaking of 2018 as the heir to 1947: one of the greatest vintages ever.

So has it lived up to the hype?

There's no easy answer to that. Certainly, some of the reds made in 2018 are remarkable. Frédéric Lafarge continues this theme, calling 2018 a

successor to 1990, or indeed 1947. Tasting the wines at that venerable estate, you can see why.

But greatness is not uniform, and there are wines that, while silky, ripe and delicious in their own right, lack the terroir definition that I'd hope for from great Burgundy.

So it's a vintage to be selective. I've done just that in the buying process, but I encourage you to chat to our team, to make sure that you're finding wines that will suit your tastes, and your budget.

Where I feel 2018 is most exciting, is in the appellations that might once have been overlooked as rustic, or unattractive. Here, the extra warmth has given a ripeness of tannins that was once missing, while terroir definition is still beautifully present.

Beaune, Corton, Savigny, Pommard, Nuits, Marsannay: it's your time to shine.

The whites: a stunning surprise

If it is the reds that will receive the greatest attention, it is the whites that are the greatest surprise: these are some of the most impressive white wines I have tasted from barrel in Burgundy, with examples matching, or even surpassing, vintages like 2014 or 2017.

Chardonnay is a grape variety that hugely benefits from high yields, allowing freshness to balance ripeness of fruit. What makes the 2018s special is their texture and freshness, with thick skins releasing loads of phenolics into the wine, which in turn makes the mouth water. They're wines you simply want to drink.

I'm adamant that in a few years time, these will be the bottles we will all be seeking out on restaurant wine lists, or desperately trying to secure for our own cellars, so now's the time to get ahead.

If reds in 2018 are wines to be selective over, whites are wines to stock up on: I'm positive that they will surprise and astonish you, as much as they have me.

Chablis, Mâcon, Beaujolais: stock up at these prices

Once again, there is remarkable value to be found away from the Côte d'Or.

Chablis, for the first time in years, has good yields: it was a pleasure to see smiles on the faces of the vignerons there. We're lucky to work with some of the region's greatest names, and in 2018 they're at the top of their game. It still astonishes me the value that can be found in this corner of Burgundy.

Further south, the wines of the Mâconnais continue to be incredibly rewarding. Like on the Côte de Beaune, high yields were the telling factor, allowing the wines to find a natural balance. These are the wines to seek out for everyday drinking: Chardonnay's historic home remains the place to go.

Meanwhile, I find myself increasingly drawn to Beaujolais, with lifted, saline wines the perfect bottles for the table, and for sharing. The '18's are charming, and in many cases profound. I intend to stock up.

The market: look behind the labels

With consistent price rises over recent years, it's understandable why Burgundy is gaining a reputation for expense.

However, this only tells part of the story. And in 2019, there are reasons to be cheerful. With cellars full, many prices have remained stable, while a slightly improved exchange rate will also help.

And more importantly, when you look away from a very few prized names, there is superb value to be found, whether in regional appellations, or in villages like Savigny-Lès-Beaune or Marsannay, St-Aubin or Chablis, Morgon or Pouilly-Fuissé.


Burgundy remains unique: a region that has the ability to beguile and amaze unlike any other. And in a vintage like 2018, it does so at every level.

There's no reason not to allow yourself to be charmed.


hablis has the distinction of being the northernmost **part of Burgundy,** and of being solely devoted to Chardonnay. Here, on the outskirts of the charming town of Chablis itself, there's intense focus on making terroir-driven whites at this edge of where Chardonnay can reliably ripen.

The spotlight is on a single hillside where all seven grands crus are planted, and we've examples from Blanchot, Valmur, Les Clos, Vaudesir and Les Preuses (as well as La Moutonne, which is not officially recognised).

that flows through Chablis itself. The wines of the left are more mineral and cool, while those on the right have more richness and intensity

Chablis is renowned for its minerality and its ageworthiness, and the best examples are exactly that. Tasting older examples, they develop more of a yeasty note than their brethren from the Côte de Beaune, and arguably remain fresher and more complex.

DOMAINE J.P. ET BENOÎT DROIN

Present in Chablis since at least 1620, nobody understands Chablis better than the Droin family. It was Jean-Paul who put the estate on the map, working with some of the region's finest vineyards, with his son Benoît, the fourteenth generation, now in control. Benoît has upped the guality considerably since taking charge. He uses less new oak that his dad, making Chablis that's crisp, precise, and that shows the differences between each of the vineyards clearly. In other words, Chablis at its very best.

Sunny and open, there are floral notes and plenty of intense citrus fruit. This is finessed, charming, and impressively long.

There's plenty of breadth and amplitude on the Vosgros this year, with notes of brioche and peaches, but still Benoît's normal lightness of touch and focus. A really nice balance of power and precision.

The sunniest plot in Chablis, and facing due south, this is opulent, bright, and very impressive. Notes of pineapple and ripe peach are brilliantly balanced with spice, and a stunning thread of acidity. Hard not to love.

This is very reserved and reticent at the moment, with so much minerality and focus. Powerful, this is a wine that will need time to come around. When it does, it will be one for the ages.

DOMAINE SAMUEL BILLAUD

Samuel only established his own domaine in 2009, but has come an awfully long way in a short time. He initially made wine in borrowed facilities, but a move to his own premises has seen the quality of his wines improve still further, and Neal Martin's assertion that he belongs in the "top échelon" of producers seems proven. With an expanded portfolio, including some of the appellation's choicest plots (including that patch of Petit Chablis bordering Les Clos), Samuel's future is bright.

A delicious Petit Chablis from Samuel, from vines on the top of the grand cru hillside, that punch above their weight. Notes of apple blossom and sea spray, with a fine, long, and complex finish.

DOMAINE LONG-DEPAQUIT

Domaine Long-Depaquit was founded in 1791, and the château, the most impressive in Chablis, has occupied a spot at the heart of the village since the 18th century. Now owned by Albert Bichot, and benefitting from the expertise of Technical Director Alain Serveau and his winemaking team, this is a Chablis domaine that is on the rise to the very top of the appellation. With the pick of their production the monopole grand cru La Moutonne, a Chablis that simply has to be tried.

This comes from vines that are on the slope at the top of the vineyard. Lemon oil and orange blossom on the nose, with a nice mealy character, plenty of gunflint and lovely salinity here. Nice density and pretty finesse on the finish, with a lovely phenolic character. This is complex and intense with lovely balance. Beautiful.

DOMAINE WILLIAM FÈVRE

William Fèvre started his eponymous domaine in 1957. He benefited from a time when no one wanted to buy the region's premiers and grands crus, so he was able to secure vines in some of the greatest vineyards here. He quickly built an enviable range of terroir, and established the domaine as one of Chablis' largest. He retired in 1998, but the estate has continued to thrive (and William remains a regular sight around the cellar, checking up on his legacy).

Plenty of elderflower and salinity here, with a pear skin texture and grapefruit pith on the finish. There's an oyster shell character, and loads of energy.

2018 Chablis 1er Cru Montée de Tonnerre

Over two hectares in three different terroirs here. Some for tension at the top of hill, some in Chapelot for richness and power, and a west-facing 1936 planting that's very mineral. Very pure and elegant, most precise wine in the cellar. Crushed rocks and oyster shell, and a touch of gunflint. Palate is so savoury and almost unforgiving, lip-tingling salinity and amazing purity on the finish. One for the purists.

2018 Chablis 1er Cru Mont de Milieu

Half a hectare of 55 year old vines. Very open on the nose, intense fresh peaches and plenty of orange flower water. Delicacy and lovely phenolics on the palate, there's grip and also a fine thread of acidity, and good reduction. Very saline on the finish, and very nice length. Finessed and long. Gourmand.

Quite generous and powerful, lots of depth and power, and loads of silky tannins here. Broad but still with that nice phenolic reduction, and plenty of finesse. Long and pure but ample too. With time will be very impressive indeed. 35% oak - approaching grands crus.

2018 Chablis Grand Cru Vaudésir

From 1.2 hectares in the sunniest spot in Chablis where the grapes are first to ripen. Very ripe pears on the palate, plenty of peach fruit and also loads of generosity, too. Lots going on here, and nicely saline palate keeps it all together. Very intense citrus, and also even a note of kiwi. But also plenty of minerality really feel the rocks here

2018 Chablis 1er Cru Vaillons

3.5 hectares in Vaillons itself, with 50 year old vines. A solar parcel, this is one to age: it will develop minerality. Quite reduced, oyster shell, and plenty of struck match. On the palate there's a bit more body and plenty of intense citrus fruit, with a nice clean finish

2018 Chablis Grand Cru Bougros

West facing part of Bougros, this is the grand cru to discover Chablis. Really generous, with oyster shell but also orange pith and plenty of nectarine and white peaches. Quite rich and powerful, and nice salinity on the finish. Very finely judged - but nice and opulent too.

Very floral, elderflower, but also richness of fruit, plenty of amplitude, but comes back together from this richness and mouth filling fruit with precision and finesse. An interesting balance.

DOMAINE JEAN-CLAUDE BESSIN

Situated away from the bright lights of Chablis itself, Jean-Claude's personality and wines are as unassuming as his position in a small courtyard in the tiny hamlet of La Chapelle Vaupelteigne. Although he trained as an architect, he decided to take on his father-in-law's vines, and his first vintage was 1992. His wines are crystalline and pure, showing the very best, unshowy side of Chablis, and he's now been joined by his son, Romain, who had previously worked as a musician.

From Jean-Claude's old vines, this Chablis is impressive and detailed, with crushed rocks and plenty of focus, too. A benchmark Chablis from one of the region's hidden gems.

2018 Chablis Grand Cru Les Clos

More than half of the four hectare plot was planted in 1947/1948 by William's dad. So much freshness and minerality, also volume in the mouth with understated fruit; pears and peaches, and also elderflower and crushed shells, and sea spray and hints of fresh ginger, even, and a touch of gunflint. So impressive and integrated - the complexity blows you away



2018 Chablis 1er Cru Fourchaume

From a plot of just over a hectare and a half, this is impressive. Vines planted in 1968 and 1974 give texture and focus, and lovely purity. Explosive and intense.

he Côte de Beaune marks the southern half of the Côte d'Or, extending from about Pernand-Vergelesses and Aloxe-Corton in the north above the town of Beaune itself down to Santenay.

Largely known for its whites from the exalted regions of Chassagne-Montrachet, Puligny-Montrachet and Meursault, the reds here can also be exceptional. Pinots from Savigny-lès-Beaune offer exceptional value, and both Pommard and

Volnay feature red premiers crus which are known to rival the very best. Beaune is also perennially underrated; don't overlook the vineyards of the appellation itself.

However the spotlight here remains firmly on the whites. So besides examples from the three greats, we've also found stunning Chardonnays from St-Romain to the north and St-Aubin to the south. With careful, precise winemaking coupled with wellpositioned plots, these are lifted whites to enjoy any night of the week, and in the best hands, some truly profound wines.



HUBERT LAMY **SAINT-AUBIN**

Olivier Lamy took over from his father Hubert in 1996, having previously worked at Méo-Camuzet. He's relentlessly revised their production practices since. Now fully organic, with wines widely considered the finest in Saint-Aubin, he continues to seek out the best ways to express terroir. In 2018 he was both the first and last in St-Aubin to be harvesting, starting on the 22nd August and finishing on 12th September. He points out varying maturation within the same plot: one single hectare plot took five different passages to harvest. However the results of such painstaking efforts are remarkable: these are some of the best whites you'll find, anywhere. (i) @domainelamy

2018 Santenay 1er Cru Blanc, Clos des Gravières

Politically the last village of the Côte d'Or, Santenay's wines were once held in higher regard. This shows why it still should be. 50 year old vines in part, but some are seven years old. There's a brilliant balance between ripe, intense fruit and cool minerality in 2018.

2018 St-Aubin 1er Cru Clos de la Chatenière

En Remilly is considered the finest vineyard in St-Aubin by many - it's the continuation of the Montrachet hillside. Notes of grapefruit and seville oranges, with remarkable drive and focus. The purity of fruit here is astonishing; as is the length.



Chassagne-Montrachet

hassagne-Montrachet is arguably overshadowed by Puligny, but is not to be forgotten, with half of Le Montrachet, all of Les Criots-Bâtard-Montrachet and a good part of Bâtard-Montrachet all counting as grands crus within its border.

With lots of growers and lots of vineyards, there's still much to be discovered in Chassagne. The whites offer a real lemon oil character, with very pure expressions of the Chardonnay grape.

There are also a few plots of Pinot Noir, and perhaps surprisingly the appellation almost entirely red, up until a few o So the examples that remain, especially in the hands of careful growers, can be stunn





DOMAINE PAUL PILLOT

2018 St-Aubin 1er Cru 'Les Pitangerets'

From a plot that borders Chassagne-Montrachet, this is a benchmark St-Aubin. There's orange blossom and sea spray on the nose, with amazing energy and purity on the finish. Finessed and lively.

2018 Chassagne-Montrachet 1er Cru Clos St Jean

From the vineyard just up the road from the winery, often better celebrated for its red wines. Cool and saline, with notes of greengage and plenty of nervous energy. Brilliant purity, here.

One of Chassagne's finest vineyards, from south of the village (it's part of the stunning trio alongside La Grande Montagne and La Romanée). There's incredible density here, with the mouthfeel of a grand cru. Spicy and floral, with such a mineral character. Elegance and length.

2018 Chassagne-Montrachet 'Les Mazures'

Thierry's dad, Paul, started bottling Mazures as a single vineyard wine, and its quality year in year out justifies the decision: Thierry considers it premier cru level. This so intense and driven, with elegant acidity and plenty of texture on the long and complex finish.

From a small parcel situated by itself up the top of the hill, La Grande Montagne is always one of Thierry's top wines. Still very shy and retiring, but with rippling energy and broad shoulders. This will be incredible.

DOMAINE BERNARD MOREAU ET EILS

Alex Moreau, and brother Benoît, have quickly lifted the estate from a producer loved by a few cognoscenti to one challenging the region's best. Their grandfather, Marcel, started the domaine, with their father taking over in 1977, and from 1982 bottling their premiers crus individually. The brothers' first vintage was in 1999, their ever-increasing renown is thanks to their superb set of Chassagnes, each of which shows off the character of its vineyard (even when they're only a few metres apart). It's no surprise that this has fast become one of the region's most sought-after domaines.






ne of the Côte d'Or's three great Chardonnay villages (alongside Chassagne and Meursault), Puligny-Montrachet is renowned as the source of some of the world's finest white wines.

Sharing Le Montrachet on its southern border with Chassagne, and with all of Chevalier Montrachet (just above Le Montrachet) and Bienvenues-Bâtard-Montrachet (next to Bâtard-Montrachet, whose southern edge dips into Chassagne) in its bounds, Puligny's prestige is no doubt due to their presence.

There's also no shortage of premiers crus, with 100 hectares of a total of 235 hectares devoted to them, nearly half the entire appellation. These can offer some of that same prestige at a friendlier price. Look for the best plots nestled in the middle of the slope that rises from east to west, where there's the ideal balance of drainage, soil complexity and aspect.

And, we're always on the lookout for excellent value from their village wines, with shining examples from the likes of Alain Chavy and Olivier Leflaive.





DOMAINE ALAIN CHAVY

Alain Chavy and his brother, Jean-Louis, split their father's vineyards in 2003, as is often the case in Burgundy. Alain works a great selection of Puligny vineyards with his son, and his traditionally-styled wines convey some of the best of Puligny-Montrachet's chiselled minerality alongside a fullness of body endowed by the wine's classical élévage. His wines get better every year, with more focus, texture, and precision. The 2018s are gorgeous, and not to be missed.




eursault is larger than its brethren Chassagne and Puligny, and has no grands crus to call its own. So its premiers crus take the spotlight, and deservedly so.

With great plots like Les Charmes, Les Perrières and Les Genevrières on the southern end towards Puligny, Meursault handily holds its own. These brilliant Chardonnays tend to be expressive, powerful and long.

We've sought mineral, nervy examples, with tension and precision in spades.







DOMAINE MICHEL BOUZEREAU

Michel Bouzereau is a man of great sway in Burgundy. He's both head of the Bouzereau clan as well as President of the prestigious Burgundy Growers' Union. There is undoubtedly quite a shadow for his son lean-Baptiste to have stepped into. However, he has been able to tread his own path, combining his father's traditionalist philosophy with a fresher, more vibrant style. The result is expressive wines from his eleven hectares of vines in Meursault and Puligny. Each cuvée is treated individually and sympathetically, leading to wines of great depth and balance.

Willing to push the boundaries, he produces wines that have everything in perfect relief: concentration, minerality, acidity and complexity. And he has fun: skis and a pool table are visible from his tasting room, and a handful of dogs run around the domaine.

Patrick Javillier began working in wine in 1974 with just two hectares, and now has more than ten, 80% of which is devoted to Chardonnay. Today, his daughter Marion produces their exceptional range, with her proud father close by. The esteem in which their estate is held is even more impressive considering their low holdings in premiers and grand crus. But this is indicative of their approach: they ensure every cuvée, from Bourgogne Blanc Côte d'Or (a new appellation in the creation of which Patrick was instrumental) upwards, fulfils its potential.

Volnay

here Volnay starts, so does Pinot Noir country in the Côte de Beaune.

It shares its border with Meursault, and most notably with Les Santenots, so either appellation can be used on the label. However, given Volnay's association with great red wines, it's the variety of choice here, with notable examples from the likes of Comtes Lafon.

But the heights of its reds are also reached with many of its premiers crus, with plots like Les Frémiets, Les Taillepieds, and Les Mitans. Indeed, quality over quantity rings true in Volnay in its hundred or so hectares, one of the smallest appellations in the Côte de Beaune. Chalky soils lead to elegant expressions of Pinot Noir, which, as connoisseurs catch on, are increasingly hard to secure.





LOUIS BOILLOT chambolle-musigny

Louis Boillot previously worked at Domaine Lucien Boillot with his father and brother in Gevrey, though the family was initially based in Volnay, hence they also have wines from this commune. Louis himself relocated to Chambolle in 2003 where his wife, Ghislaine Barthod, is based, and they now share the same vineyard team, plus a German pointer appropriately called Musigny. From several notable appellations, Louis crafts wines that are united in their commitment to terroir, their clarity and their depth. He also has an impressive concern further south in Moulinà-Vent, making some of the most Pinot-like Beaujolais we know.

They think the 2018s have the character of the 1990s, or even the 1959s: they know better than us!

ere in Pommard, only red wine is made, on its iron-rich soils. It's larger, and its wines tend to be bigger, than its direct neighbour Volnay. And their appeal is exactly that: they offer more powerful expressions of Pinot Noir which age brilliantly.

There are a few crus in Pommard which get all the hype. There's long been a movement to elevate the premier cru Rugiens-Bas to grand cru status, and the monopole Clos des Epeneaux, a walled five hectare plot in the center of town, is always quick to sell out.

Fortunately, there's more to Pommard than just its superstars. We've been careful to select wines true to its terroir, where dark fruit and cool, iron-oxide notes are what makes them tick.



COMTE ARMAND

With the Clos des Epeneaux in the hands of the Comte Armand since 1826, this estate celebrates a rich and successful history. 2014 was young Beaune native Paul Zinetti's first vintage at the helm of the nine hectare domaine. Here is a winemaker with a golden touch and high aspirations, not least to see the Epeneaux climat awarded grand cru classification.

n the outskirts of the eponymous town itself, these vineyards are the most accessible for an evening walk, which is ironic given that they are also often the most overlooked. With both Chardonnay and Pinot Noir grown here, there are excellent examples of both from the appellation. It has an impressive number of premiers crus (42), and the town itself is home to many of the most important négociants.

With both sandy soils and some steeper plots, there are both lighter and more powerful examples of wines here, so aspect is important. There's also exceptional value to be found, when you look in the right places.

DOMAINE CHANSON

Beaune is often overlooked, but Domaine Chanson is the benchmark here, making impressive, ageworthy wines. The domaine's 15th century cellars, situated in the historic centre of Beaune, were bought by Bollinger in 1999 and fully modernised. 

Wine has been made here since Roman times, despite its forbidding continental climate where frost remains a constant threat. But this tension is key to the unfailingly complex wines that emerge when grapes are actually produced.

This northern half of the Côte d'Or is home to the most famous grands crus like Romanée-St-Vivant and Musigny, but actually covers fourteen appellations. From Marsannay and **Fixin** in its northern boundary, known for more earthy examples, through to the endlessly elegant wines of Chambolle-Musigny and more masculine bottles from Nuits-St-Georges, there's a whole lot to take in from vineyard to vineyard and vintage to vintage.





DOMAINE GÉRARD JULIEN ET FILS **COMBLANCHIEN**

The town of Comblanchien is yet to attract more attention for fine wine than for its quarries, but I'm sure that's about to change. And it's thanks to Etienne Julien. We discovered this brilliant young winemaker (his first vintage was 2012) thanks to a tip-off from his friend and fellow rising star Maxime Cheurlin of Domaine Georges Noëllat. We can only recommend you start buying his wines now before word is truly out. Joyful, energetic and vivacious, these Pinot Noirs are a true hedonist's delight. (i) @etienne_julien21

From their excellent range of vineyards and 18th century cellars, with monopoles including Clos de l'Arlot and Clos des Forêts St-Georges, Domaine de l'Arlot creates the most elegant, refined and classy Nuits-St-Georges imaginable.



A rather more recent addition was his tiny parcel of grand cru Clos de Vougeot, bought by Michel's father for his son's twelfth birthday, although he's adamant he would have preferred a bike! Now Michel's son, Pierre, is joining the estate: he's the seventh generation of the Gros family to take control here.

This is an estate with an amazing set of organically-managed vineyards, where they work with five different barrel makers to maintain optimal balance in the wines. Under the control of cousins Nicole, the winemaker, and Nathalie, who looks after the commercial side, Lamarche are back where they belong, near the top of the Vosne-Romanée tree.

These have fast become some of our favourite wines from Burgundy.

A tiny domaine with just 4.5 hectares of vines covering an impressive 12 appellations, including two grands crus, it's been run by the young and dynamic Stéphane since 2008. He's the fourth generation here, and works exactly the same vines as his great grandfather did in 1897 when he purchased the land. Indeed, many of the same, historic vines in place. Minimal new oak and light extractions ensure these wines are expressive and complex, with real finesse. They're as pure as Pinot gets, and we're sure Stéphane's star is only set to rise.



Indeed, his 79-year old father is still involved. They've exceptional terroir: 13.5 hectares from which 19 wines are made, six of which are premiers crus and four grands crus. These wines are a lesson in the reasons why sensitive handling of great vineyards leads to equally great wines.

DOMAINE DES LAMBRAYS

The estate itself was bought by LVMH in 2014, and there's been plenty of change here since, with Thierry retiring, and in spring this year, the arrival of Jacques Desvauges from near neighbour Clos de Tart (and formerly of Domaine de l'Arlot). But the northern premiers crus, like Le Clos St lacques, mustn't be overlooked. Some of these might have successfully applied for grand cru status, but their owners elected not to in order to avoid the steeper taxes.



Founded in 1825 and still under family control, now in the hands of the seventh generation, Erwan and his sister Eve, Faiveley is one of Burgundy's largest vineyard owners and remains a consistent purchaser of grands crus grapes. They remain committed to displaying each of terroir in its purest form, and this is a set of wines which shows no hint of the behemoth behind it, except their superb quality. Erwan remains present in the vineyard and the cellar, hands-on despite their size. Defined and very fine, they are beautiful expressions of Pinot Noir.

Owning one of Meursault's most celebrated estates, Dominique Lafon could have been happy with his lot. But in 1999 he bought a few hectares of vineyards in Milly-Lamartine in the Mâconnais, an hour or so to the south, seeking a new challenge. Many of his peers thought he was mad, but Dominique quickly proved them wrong (so much so that many other Côte de Beaune producers have since followed). He's added further land since those early years, and appointed talented winemaker Caroline Gon to manage the estate in 2006. She's led its conversion to organic viticulture, and they're some of the best wines coming out of the Mâconnais, and some of the best value wines coming out of Burgundy.

While the Mâconnais has seen an influx of winemakers from the Côte de Beaune in search of new challenges and more (cheaper) land, there are some producers with a considerably longer history in the region. And amongst them, one name stands out: Château de Fuissé. It was bought by the Vincent family in 1862 (just eight years after Lay & Wheeler was founded). Since 2003 it's the fifth generation, Antoine, at the helm, with his brother-in-law Philippe (who used to work at Olivier Leflaive). They offer the same intensity as many of their neighbours, but with added complexity and elegance that would not look out of place further north. All grapes in their 42 hectares are harvested by hand, and when their value, history and ageworthiness are considered, they're clearly one of this fast-emerging region's gems.

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GUY BRETON MORGON

A new producer for Lay & Wheeler, Guy Breton started out as a fuel salesman, but soon realised his true calling was wine. He went to learn with Marcel Lapierre, the master of low-sulphur, elegant Beaujolais. And he soon became one of the 'gang of four', named by legendary US importer Kermit Lynch, for the way that they were revolutionising the production of Beaujolais. Guy hates tannin in wine, seeking a pure and lifted expression of the Gamay grape. He uses old oak barrels (that he sources from Domaine de la Romanée Conti), and the altitude of his vines ensures some of the most finessed Beaujolais out there. Indeed, when Guy started out, some of his peers wondered whether he'd ever get his grapes to ripen. Thanks to a warming climate, these veteran vines are now perfectly placed.


